Celebrating Our Growth in 2011 and Looking Toward 2012

At the end or 2010, we had seen a 20% increase in the number of counseling hours provided to our clients. We predicted then that 2011's increase would break that record. But we are astounded by the reality.

Early in the year so many clients were requesting our help that we were forced to maintain a waiting list. So, beginning in July, two additional counselors were added to our team, allowing clients to be seen 5 days a week at our Center office, plus one day a week in Fairfield Glade.

The unexpected result was a stunning increase in the number of counseling hours provided in 2011 (830.5): a whopping 71% increase over 2010. Our counselors were able to see 24% more clients than in 2010 (130 separate individuals or families).

We began 2012 by celebrating the launch of our new web site: ccotp.org. We also have begun making plans for a pilot program in Sparta, TN, where no counselors work at all! But all this growth is costly. Each hour of counseling costs \$31.93 more than fees collected. We believe this is God's ministry
