A Look Back at Ten Years of Service: 2002 - 2012

At age 10, we share with you a bit of our history.

We began seeing clients in an office in downtown Crossville furnished with two lawn chairs and a desk! During that first year, we provided 302 total hours of counseling. We grew slowly at first, averaging between 300 and 400 hours a year.

As we matured, our rate of growth increased. By 2011 we had doubled both the number of counselors (from 2 to 4) and the number of counseling hours (830). In 2012, the number of counseling hours provided had tripled

over year one, to 955.

We have also grown in several other ways. In 2009, we began seeing clients in Fairfield Glade, and last year open an additional office in Sparta.

We started with the financial support of five area churches. Now six congregations support our work, and we receive generous grants from four agencies, including our local United Fund.

As we have grown, so has our reputation. Last year almost 40% of our clients found us through the personal recommendation of a friend or former

client. Another 20% were referred by area churches and medical offices. And our reputation has reached further, bringing clients from Cumberland and 6 surrounding counties. To make it easier to find us, we launched our new web site in 2012: www.cccotp.org.

We participated in Project DEAR (Drug-Endangered and At-Risk Youth), a county-wide effort to better serve area children and families at risk.

But most important of all, we are grateful for the continued support of our donors and the privilege of witnessing transformation in the lives of our clients.



- We welcome our new counselor, Katie Smiley Burns, MA in School and Professional Counseling, to the team. Her presence with us will double the number of counseling hours available for children and teens.
- Christian Counseling Center's first formal three-year Strategic Plan is being implemented, beginning with a renewed emphasis on increasing our visibility. To that end, we will be adding a Community Relations Coordinator to our team.
