2013: A Year of New Endeavors

Now in its 11th year of operation, Christian Counseling Center has concentrated its effort on providing services not readily available in our service area, ensuring financial stability, and strengthening its reputation in the community.

Although Christian Counseling Center has always provided counseling to children, adults, and couples, we have strengthened our ability to serve our clients in several ways:

 Our pilot project, a satellite office in Sparta, TN, has proven successful and has been made a permanent part of our service offerings.

- One of our counselors has continued advanced training in an approach to couples therapy that research has shown to be effective.
- We equipped a Play Therapy Center to provide effective guided play therapy to children as young as age 3.
- We conducted a preteen girls' selfesteem workshop, one of many such workshops to come.

We were also blessed by the generosity of our community this year. Christian Counseling Center conducted its First Annual Fundraising Event "Happiness Is . . . " on August 24th at

the Palace Theater. That same weekend, a special event "A Night of Fun and Music" was held at Christ Lutheran Church featuring, kimNdennis, a husband-wife duo from Michigan. A freewill offering was taken to help us serve our clients.

We also conducted a year-end Annual Appeal Letter Campaign. Over twice as many donors contributed to our cause during that campaign than in our 2012 campaign.

To all of you who contributed to our work, we thank you. With your help, more clients can be helped to heal and to lead full, meaningful lives.





Christian Counseling Center is a 501(c) (3) nonprofit agency. We are partially funded by six area churches, generous grants from United Fund, Baptist Healing Trust, Community Foundation of Middle TN, VECustomers Share, MR Foundation and individual donor contributions.

Our Clients in 2013

Our clients come from many places. Last year one-third of our clients found us through the personal recommendation of a friend or former client. Another third were referred through medical offices, churches, nonprofits, and government agencies. And almost 20% of our new clients found us on the Internet and through our web site, www.cccotp.org.

And they bring many issues. Over 20% of our clients suffered from depression, a few considered suicide before coming, another 20% had relationship concerns, 12% wanted help with parenting or children's behavior issues, over 12% were dealing with anxiety and life stressors, 7% were concerned about substance use in a family member or themselves, and 5% were grieving a loss. Almost 20% of our clients were children and teens.
